

## Speech Resources in the Tamasheq Language


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## In this paper we...

- 1. Produce a Tamasheq to French speech translation corpus (17h).
  - → The Tamasheq language: ~500 thousand speakers, Tuareg variety, Berber macro-language spoken by nomadic tribes across North Africa in Algeria, Mali, Niger and Burkina Faso.
- 2. Distribute a 641h audio collection in five languages from Niger:
  - → French (FRA), Fulfulde (FUV), Hausa (HAU), Tamasheq (TAQ) and Zarma (DJE).
